Message from the Chair

Sigthor Einarsson, *ISTAT Foundation Chair, Partner – ICELEASE*



Being fresh on duty as ISTAT Foundation Chair, let me start by thanking my predecessor for his exemplary work over the past three years. Under Peter Huijbers' leadership, the ISTAT Foundation managed to do exactly what we should do as a foundation, and that is to act counter-cyclically. Initially, with the pandemic, and currently with the war in Ukraine and associated impact on many lives and

our economy, Peter led us to making a greater financial impact than “pre-COVID,” despite having times when many companies struggled to survive and gave less, if at all, to charities and foundations.

We were able to do this with the endless support and dedication of our trustees, committee members and HQ Staff, our golf event donors, ISTAT as well as the ISTAT members who supported our matching campaign for the Ukraine Relief Fund.

The first project was the establishment of a COVID-19 Relief Fund which was funded by a special grant from ISTAT of US \$500,000 and helped 12 institutions globally to battle the pandemic. Whilst we had requests for seven times that amount, we were able to deploy these funds in record time over the summer of 2020.

The second project was the Ukraine Relief fund, where we set ourselves an ambitious target of US \$1M – that ultimately was achieved! We used US \$300,000 of our reserves, obtained immediate support by Air Lease Corporation of US \$100,000 and then received the commitment from ISTAT for a matching campaign that would support up to another US \$300,000. ISTAT members provided the US \$300,000 that ISTAT matched and thus created a massive relief support via Airlink to Ukraine. Also, the Flying Angels Foundation benefitted from this fund.

Finally, as a third project, following the establishment of the Diversity & Inclusion Committee, we sought to set up a D&I fund that supported African students to study at universities in Africa as well as female students in Latin America. The fund would also target universities that were developing STEM programs in Africa and Latin America. In June of 2022, we were very pleased to announce that Aviation Capital Group committed US \$100,000 to this fund, which will be deployed to these target groups in batches of US \$20,000 over the next five years.

The above examples show that the ISTAT Foundation can create and realize “boxed-in” projects, along with running its core giving programs – Scholarships, Internships and Mentorships, Education and ISTAT U, Grants and Humanitarian Aid. These programs have deployed an average of US \$800,000 annually over the last few years. Meanwhile, the pandemic leaves the ISTAT Foundation facing a sharp decline in its conventional income, which is reflected in painful budget cuts to our 2023 operations.

With all the above in mind, a strategic review of the ISTAT Foundation coinciding with the start of my tenure is a welcoming benefit. I look forward to sharing the outcome in the coming months. One thing is certain, the ISTAT Foundation will continue to proudly “give back to the industry,” a mantra which has been at the core of its existence from the start.

The coming pages will provide you with the individual stories of each of the committee chairs, including that of the Communications & Promotions Committee which has done a stellar job of sharing our work with the ISTAT membership. Please join me in a big thank you to all my fellow ISTAT Foundation trustees and committee members, with very special thanks to Peter Huijbers as departing Chair.

The Scholarship Committee is one of the central initiatives that triggered the origination of the Foundation. Started in 1994, the ISTAT Foundation was intended as a vehicle that would enable successful aviation professionals to give something back to the industry. From very humble beginnings with the then realistic objective to grow the ISTAT Foundation assets to US \$300,000, it has developed into a charitable source for academic scholarships, humanitarian giving and grants for charitable organizations within the aviation industry. Assets of the ISTAT Foundation are now approximately \$6 million. To date, we have awarded over US \$4M in scholarships. For our 2022 ISTAT Foundation Scholarship program, we awarded US \$433,500 to worthy students.

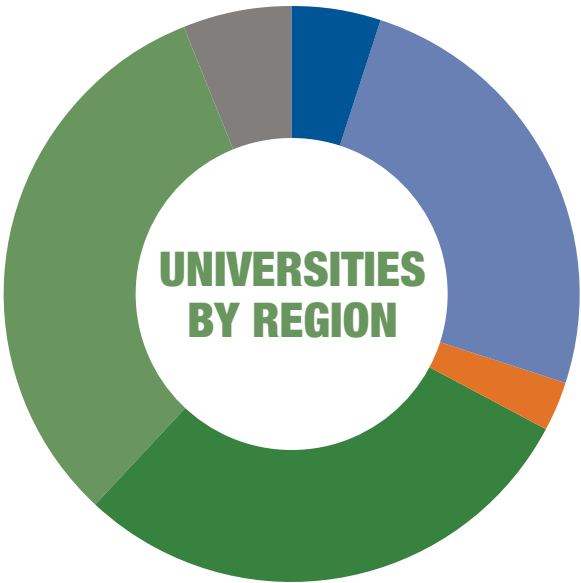
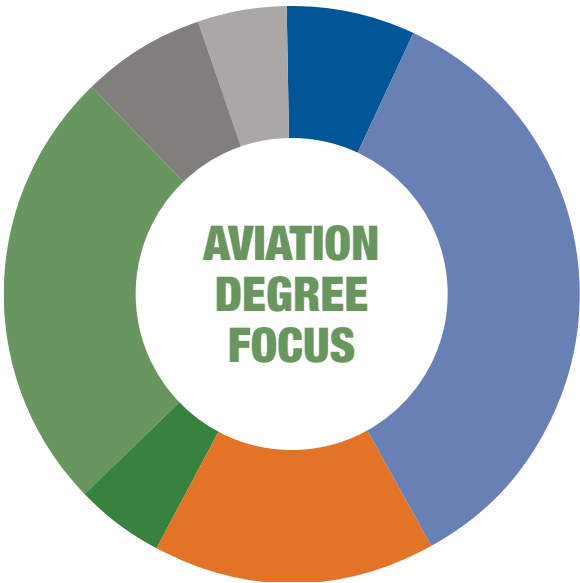
The Scholarship Committee solicits applications for its scholarships from a network of aviation-focused universities across the globe in Africa, Asia, Europe, North America and South America. The scholarships are intended to provide financial support to students pursuing an undergraduate or graduate degree in programs focused on the aviation studies. This generally runs the spectrum from engineering in aviation-related fields to finance programs related to aircraft finance and leasing to aviation law. Applications are reviewed and scored by our committee, which is comprised of a dedicated group of ISTAT members with diverse

aviation industry and demographic backgrounds. Upon completion of the committee’s review, the highest scoring applicants are eligible to receive scholarships of up to US \$30,000.

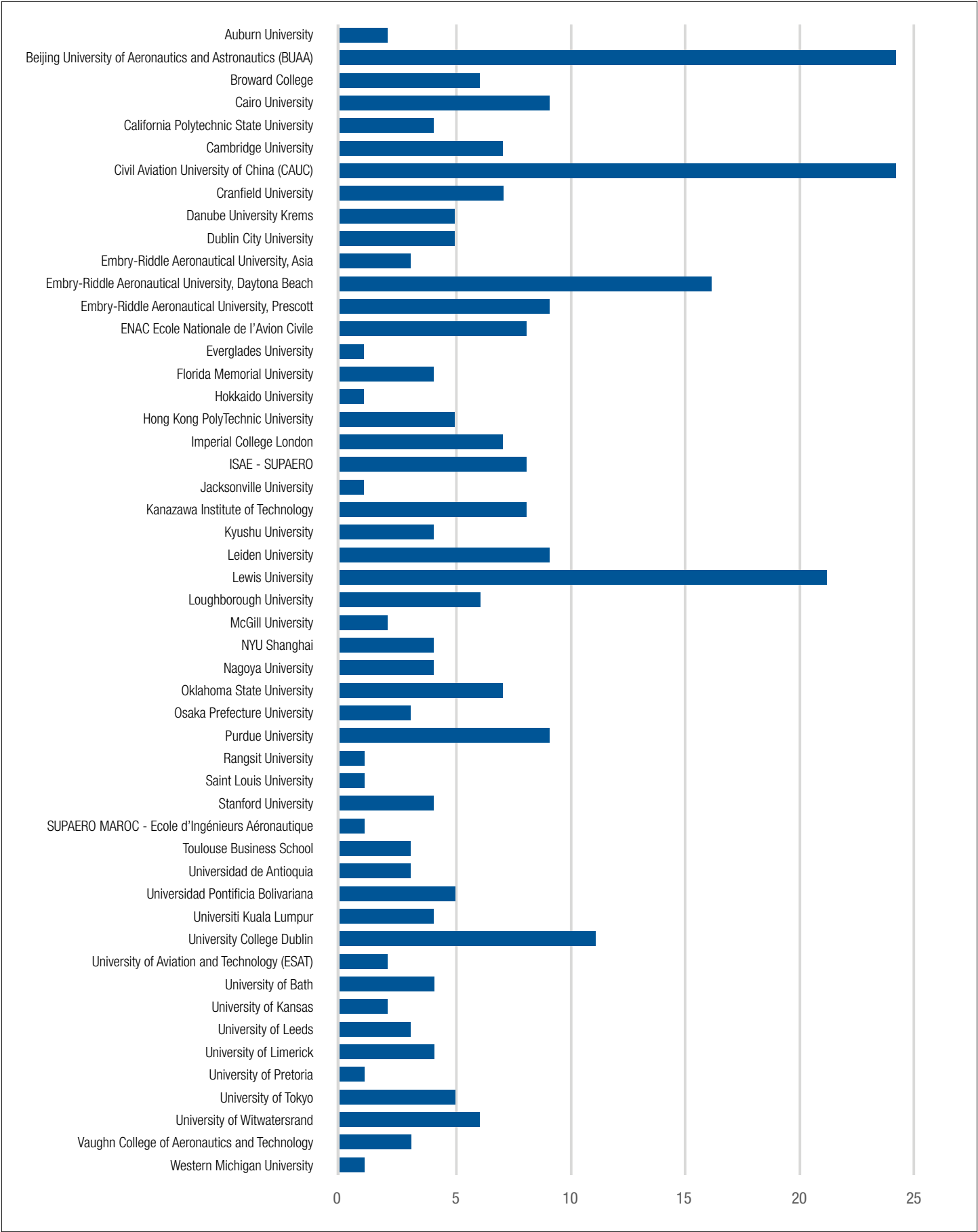
Our award process has shown that the gender diversity of award winners mirrors that of the applicants. That is to say if 30% of the applicants are female, and, generally, 30% of the awards have been given to females solely based on each applicant’s performance. We have actively been pursuing expansion of our base in Africa, South America, Asia and the Middle East. Within the last five years alone, we have awarded scholarships to students who represent 55 nationalities. The committee remains dedicated to the expansion of our base in Africa, South America, Asia and the Middle East.

From a personal perspective, I find participating in the scholarship award process to be deeply rewarding. As one of the original founders of ISTAT in 1983, I have witnessed terrific growth and recognition of ISTAT in the industry that has enabled ISTAT, through the ISTAT Foundation, to show the true heart and soul of the aviation community. We try to help as much as we can. Our work in providing financial assistance to worthy students who want to be part of our industry through the Scholarship Committee is an honor, and I am thankful to be a part of our team of eleven dedicated committee members.

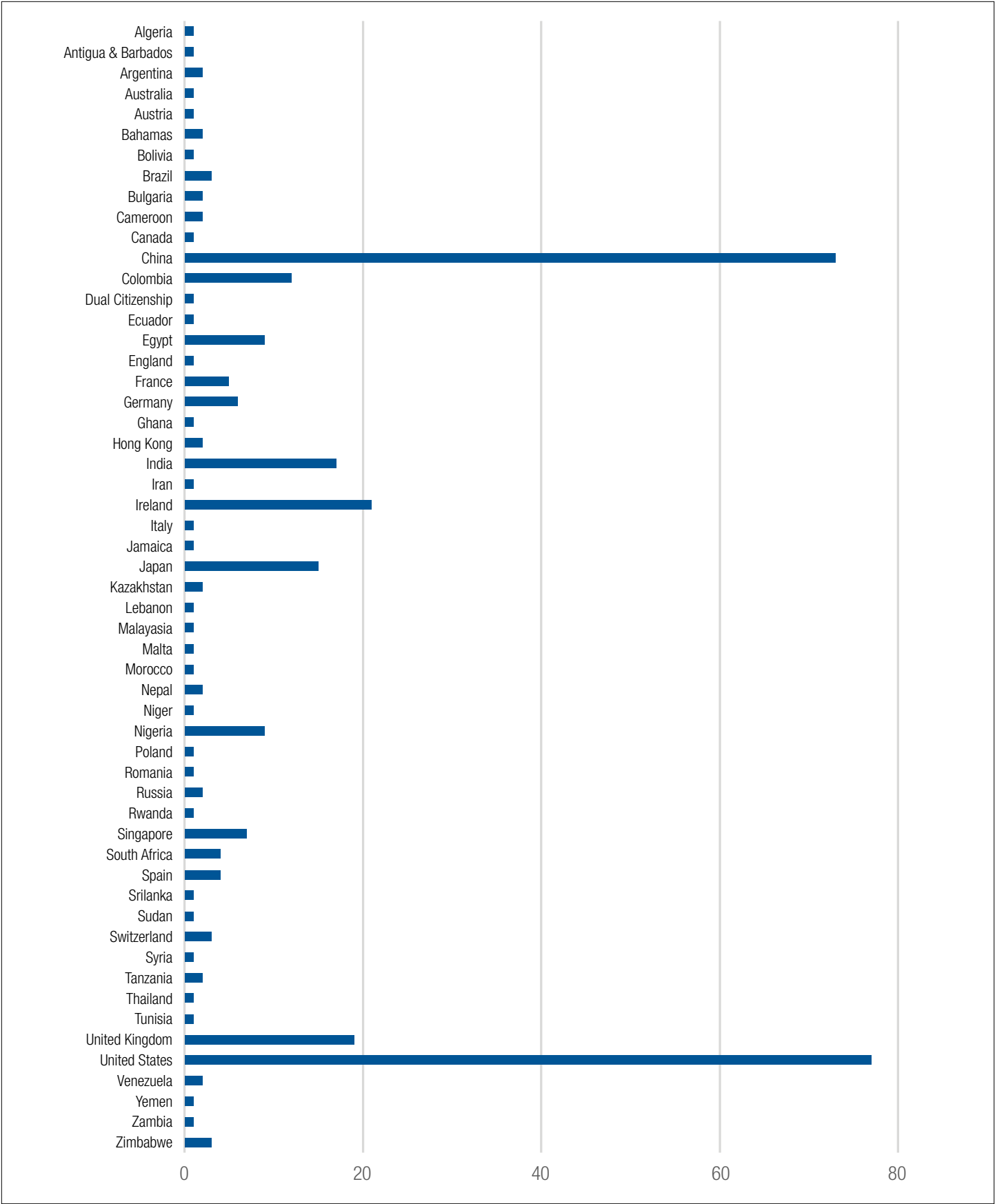


Scholarship Recipients by University (2018-2022)

A Message from the Chair

In today's job market, just having a degree from a top-notch university is no longer sufficient to secure that all-important job offer, particularly in the highly competitive, global aviation industry. Nowadays, relevant work experience is as valuable as the degree and high scores from exams when it comes

to starting out or advancing a successful career. As a result, internships are an essential way to help aspiring professionals stand out amid an overcrowded pool of candidates.

According to the National Association of Colleges and Employers¹, more than half of all graduating seniors who applied for a full-time job (53.2%) received at least one job offer. Within this group, 57.5% of students who had an internship and 43.7% of graduating seniors who did not have an internship received a job offer. In terms of the average number of job offers, graduating seniors who applied for a full-time job and participated in an internship received 1.17 job offers; those who did not have an internship received 0.98 offers. These statistics demonstrate the impact of internship experience and the pay status of those internships.

The mission of ISTAT Foundation is to promote the advancement of commercial aviation and humanitarianism, and the Internship & Mentorship Programs acts as its mission's principal pillars. The ISTAT Foundation recognizes that internships and mentorship play a crucial role in shaping one's career. Interns and student mentees benefit from the invaluable experiences gained because of their participation in the program. The Internship & Mentorship Programs connect ISTAT member companies and their executives with qualified university and graduate-

level students around the globe who desire to become productive members in the aviation leasing, airline, OEM, MRO, financing and trading industries.

I am proud to be serving as Chair of this important committee. Over the past five years, 38 ISTAT member companies have hired interns through the Internship Program, providing employment to a total of 71 students, which, in many instances, has led to long-term post-graduate employment. Together with fellow committee members, we are heavily invested in initiatives that advance the goal of fostering the development of the next generation of commercial aviation industry professionals. As a participating employer through my company, Zeevo Group, I continue to lead by example by focusing on global outreach that attracts a candidate pool that is more diverse, both professionally and geographically.

Aside from the growth in the number of companies and students engaged in the Internship & Mentorship Programs, it is this type of meaningful impact that brings the Internship & Mentorship Committee the most fulfillment. The Internship Program aspires to continue growing, targeting 100 annual student placements by 2024.

As our careers continue to soar to new heights, our past experiences and opportunities are what ground us and provide us with the foundation to propel forever forward. When considering an investment in the future of our industry, the "rising executive" students, interns and young professionals are our most valuable commodity and will undoubtedly provide the greatest returns to our industry.

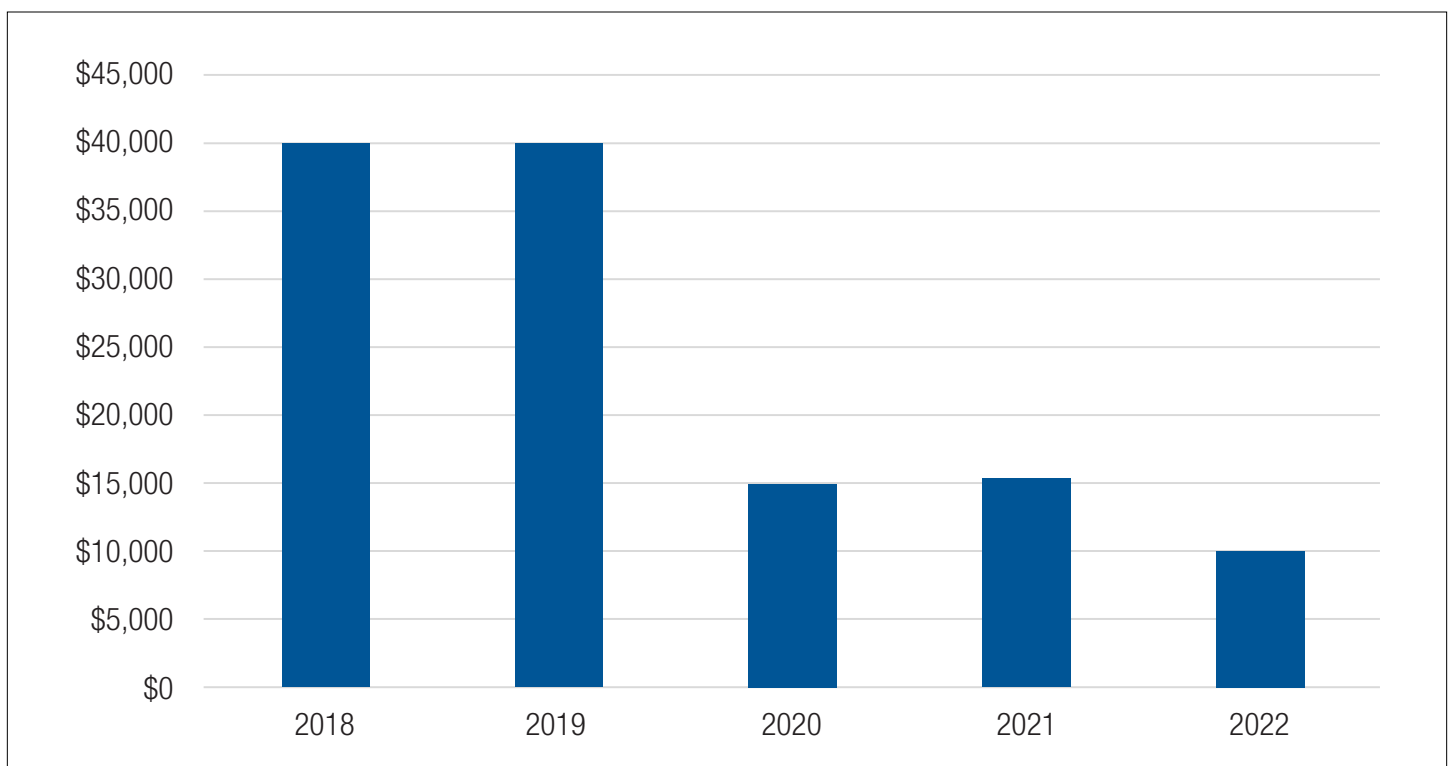

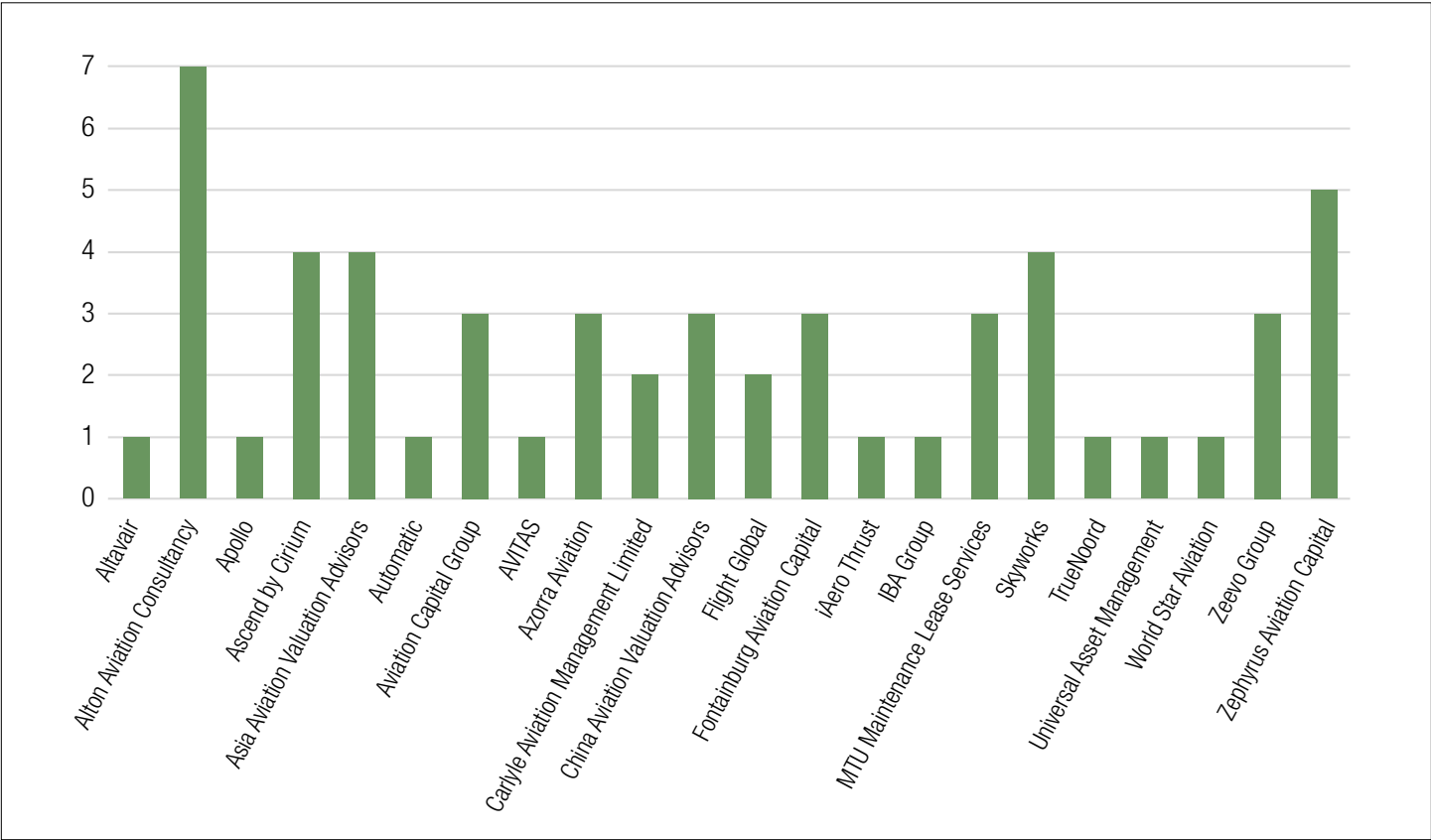

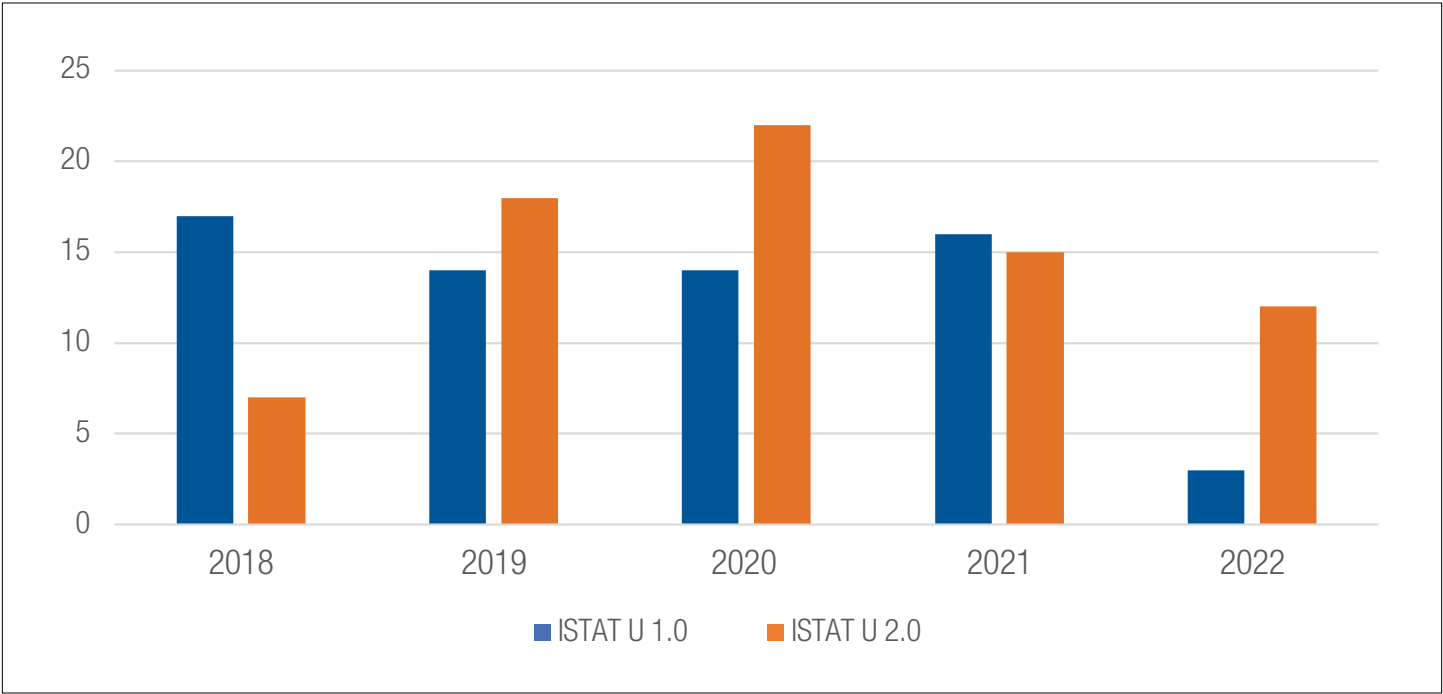

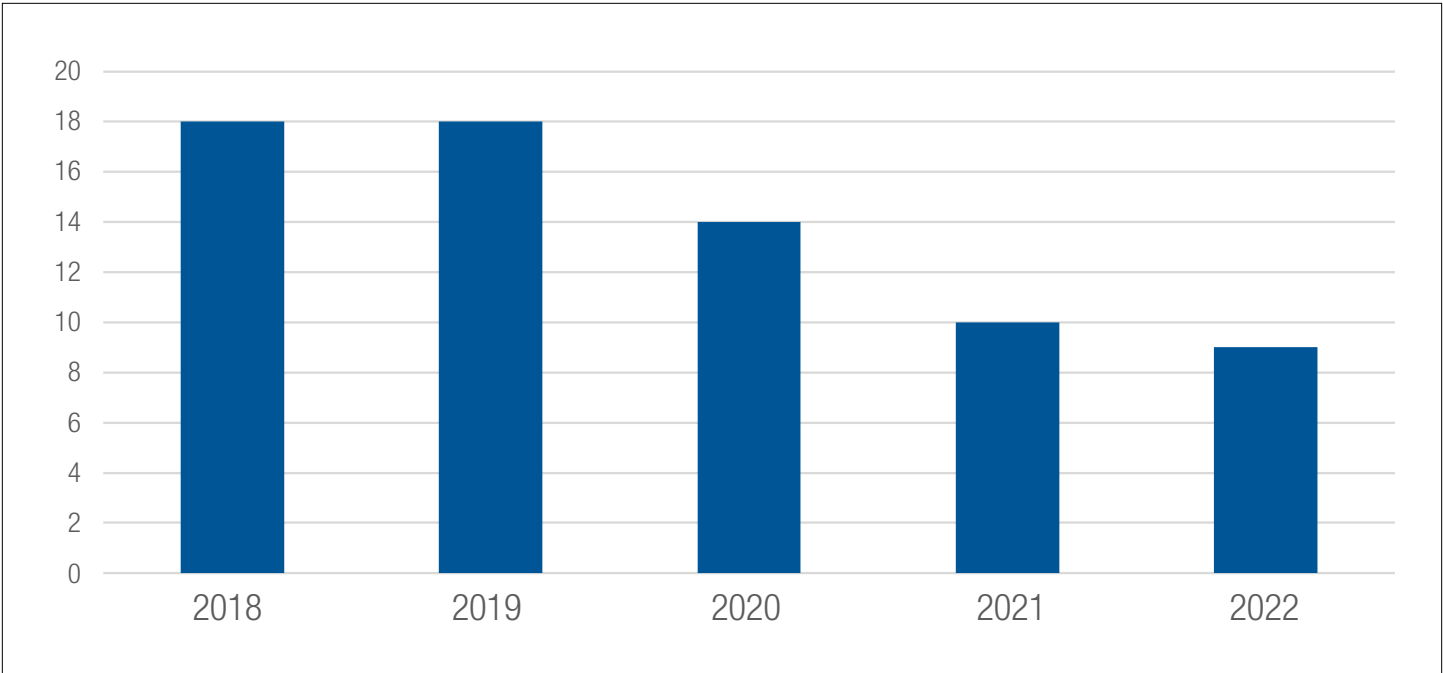

ISTAT U 1.0 and 2.0 Graduates – 2018-2022



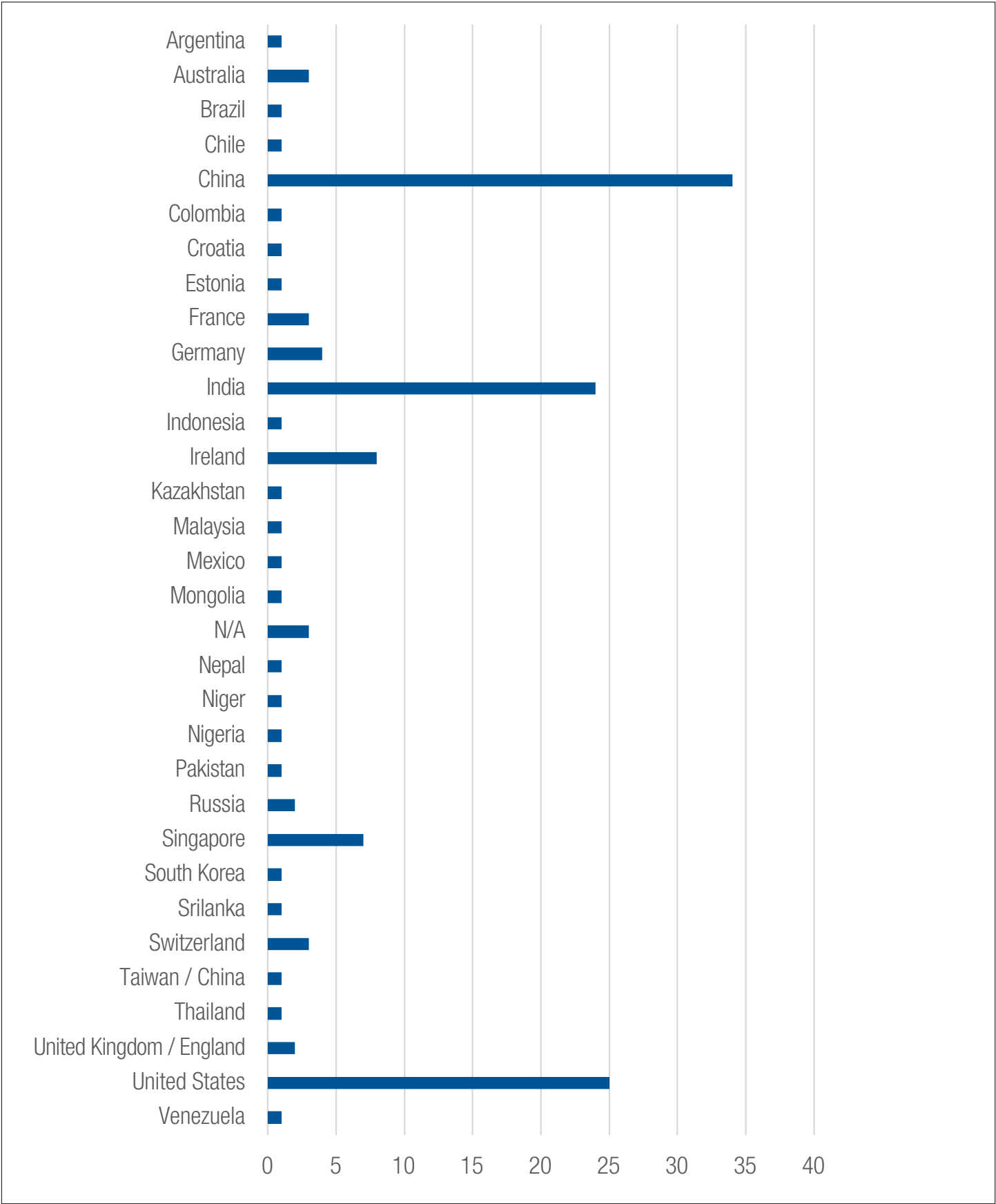

- Seek opportunities to expand ISTAT U programs to additional institutions and regions around the world, and
- Exploring ISTAT U enhancements and variations.

A Message from the Chair

The ISTAT Foundation Grants Program was established as a way to give back to the aviation industry and help promote its growth. The program specifically targets and supports aviation-related, nongovernmental, not-for-profit organizations around the world that help advance commercial

aviation. Our recipients which include museums, youth associations and educational institutions create awareness of and make aviation accessible to students and children.

I have personally supported the ISTAT Foundation Grants Program since 2017 because I know firsthand how important early exposure is for youth. My passion for aviation began after attending my first airshow at a young age. Not having previous exposure, the airshow was instrumental as an introduction to the industry. My growing desire led me to enroll into flight school, and I received my Private Pilot Certificate at age 18. From that point forward, I was motivated to build my career within aviation. The ISTAT Foundation funding these types of organizations is vital as supporting programs can often be the child's first exposure to our industry.

Since 2010, the ISTAT Foundation has awarded US \$1.1M in grants to 67 global non-profit organizations supporting the advancement

of commercial aviation. In 2022, 44 global organizations submitted applications resulting in a funding request over US \$500,000. The ISTAT Foundation Grant funds of US \$145,000 allowed the program to support 17 organizations across the US, Europe, Africa, Latin America and Asia. While the program was only able to fund a portion of the total request, 2022 was a record year for global reach as nearly 50% of the grant recipients were non-US organizations. In an effort to continue this worldwide diversification trend, the committee expanded and now includes volunteer representation from Africa, Asia, Europe, Latin America and the U.S. The committee is passionate about our mission and our recipients. This passion was illustrated when several of the committee members took a self-funded trip to Kenya to support 2022 grant recipient African Leaders in Aviation last September. The Grants Committee plans to continue these types of efforts into 2023 and is excited for what can be accomplished.

It's quite remarkable to know that through the support of generous donations, the ISTAT Foundation is able to help fund organizations that are influencing thousands of students to be part of our industry. Our donors truly make a world of difference, and we are extremely grateful for these relationships.

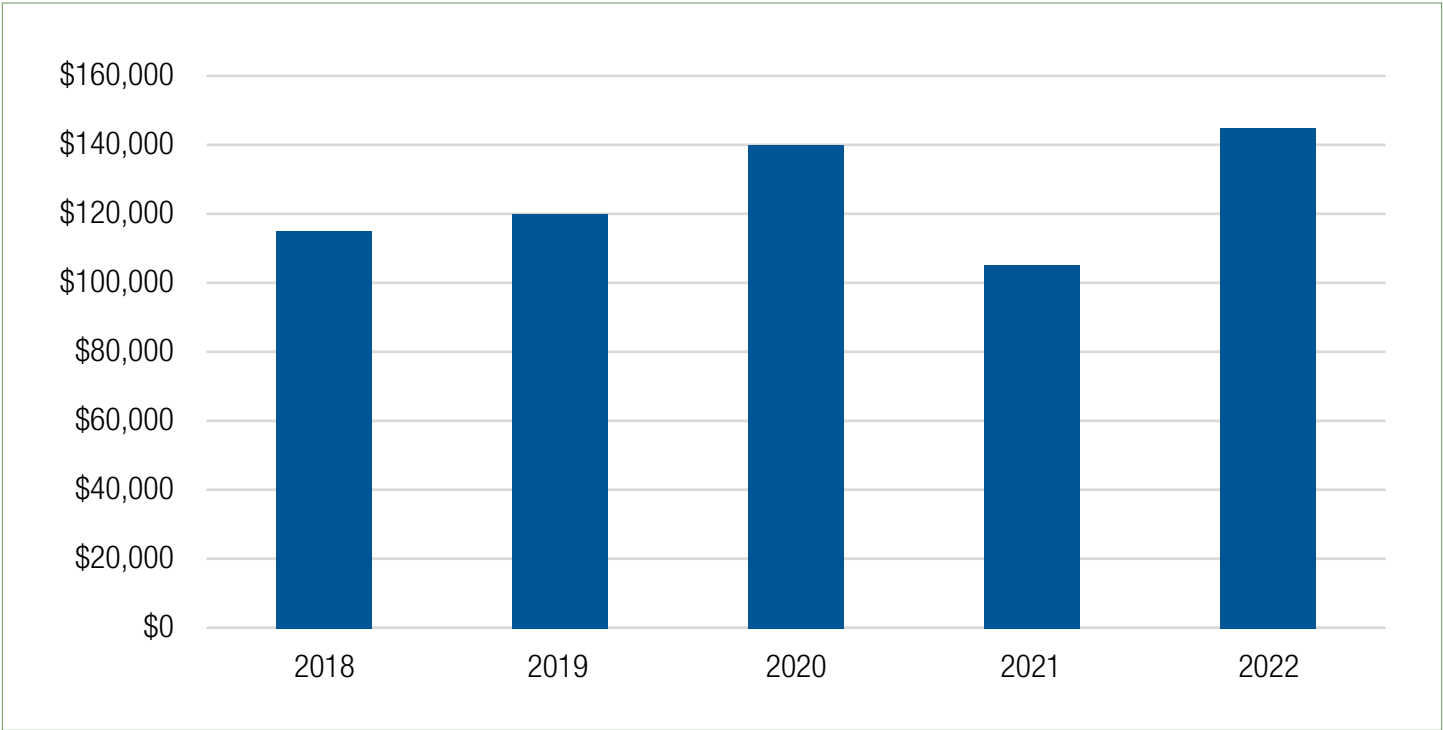

A Message from the Chair

The Humanitarian Committee of the ISTAT Foundation is tasked to evaluate and disperse grant funding allocated annually to support organizations across the globe that use the power of aviation to help save lives, promote human welfare and alleviate suffering.

As a background, the Humanitarian Committee was founded in 2013. Since then, our team has either directly (or indirectly through Airlink) coordinated the distribution of just over US \$3,889,000 of ISTAT Foundation-allocated funding. Despite the devastating impact on the aviation industry from COVID-19 and the ravages of the war in Ukraine over the past year, this giving was supported and indeed increased through the ISTAT Foundation to support the many aviation-related charities and communities worldwide.

Our team, including myself, are all ISTAT volunteers with a real passion for making a difference: to give back, raise awareness, review and evaluate applications for financial support and then resource these needs.

While each year, we strive to make a difference. It is worth pointing out that in 2021, we supported 13 qualifying charitable organizations across the globe. In 2022, this rose to 15 recipients; however, we also demonstrated the ability to react to emerging issues in the past five years with Cyclone Idai in 2019 and in Afghanistan in early 2022 when we were able to release US \$25,000 to support an Airlink-coordinated emergency airlift of medical supplies to remote provinces. The crisis in Afghanistan led quickly to the enormous and growing crisis in Ukraine where we also stepped up with an early donation to Airlink for critical lift.

The ISTAT Foundation was able to use the platform of the ISTAT Americas conference in San Diego in early March to generate momentum for a very significant aid campaign towards relief for the Ukraine crisis with a goal to reach US \$1M for the fund. This target was reached in October 2022. Every dollar of the fund went directly to supported, vetted charities and organizations providing essential services for Ukraine.

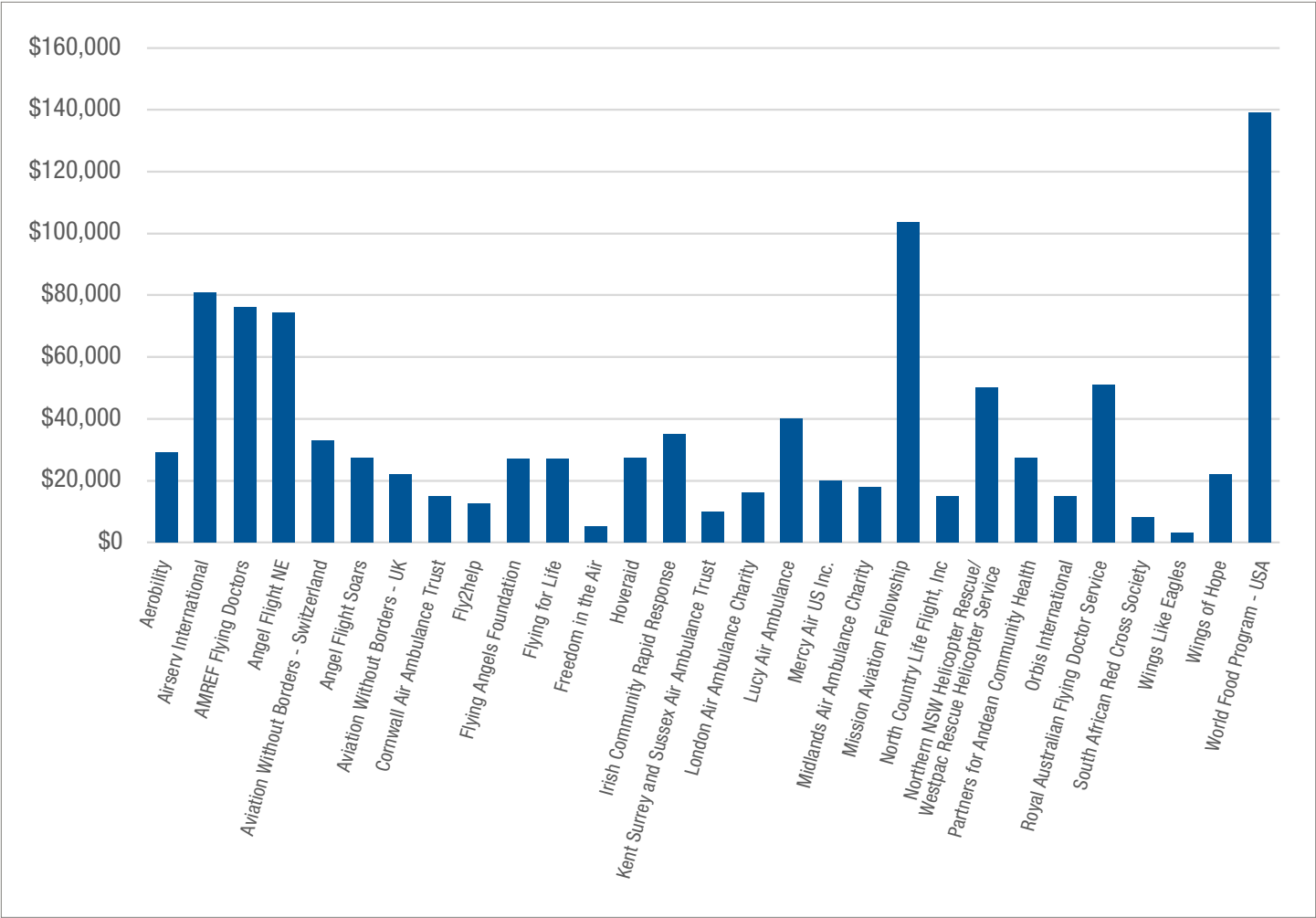
While 2022 was another busy year, demanding unique responses, we believe that change is good and will stimulate further activities. 2023 has so far taken this to a totally different level with the responses needed to support the continuing crises in Ukraine. While our budget for giving is more restrictive in 2023, the Humanitarian Committee still has its own plans for the future, shifting focus further to less developed parts of the world as well as considering where there is a positive impact on the environment (ESG), flooding, climate catastrophes or areas of urban mobility – dealing with “last mile” of disaster relief. Our consideration will always include gender diversity and impact to the environment in all our decisions.

We believe there is a place for the Humanitarian Committee working with NGO's in crisis relief as we did with the Cyclone Idai response in 2019, working closer to Airlink in response to the crisis in Beirut in 2020 as well as the recent responses in Afghanistan in 2021 and the ongoing crisis in Ukraine in 2022 and more to come in 2023. However, at the end of the day, the committee represents you – our members and volunteers. Without which, we would not have the opportunity to make a difference, and for that, and on behalf of the whole committee and the committees that have gone before us, I would just say thank you for everything you have done and everything you will do in the future.

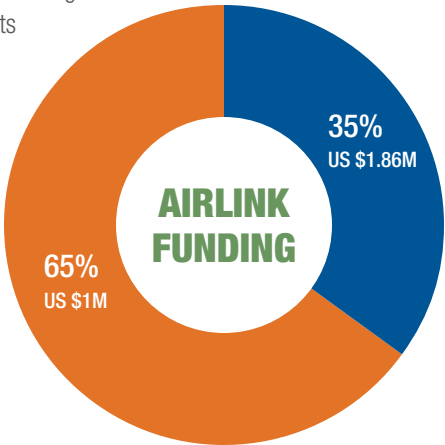
Humanitarian Aid Recipients - Total Funding (2018-2022)

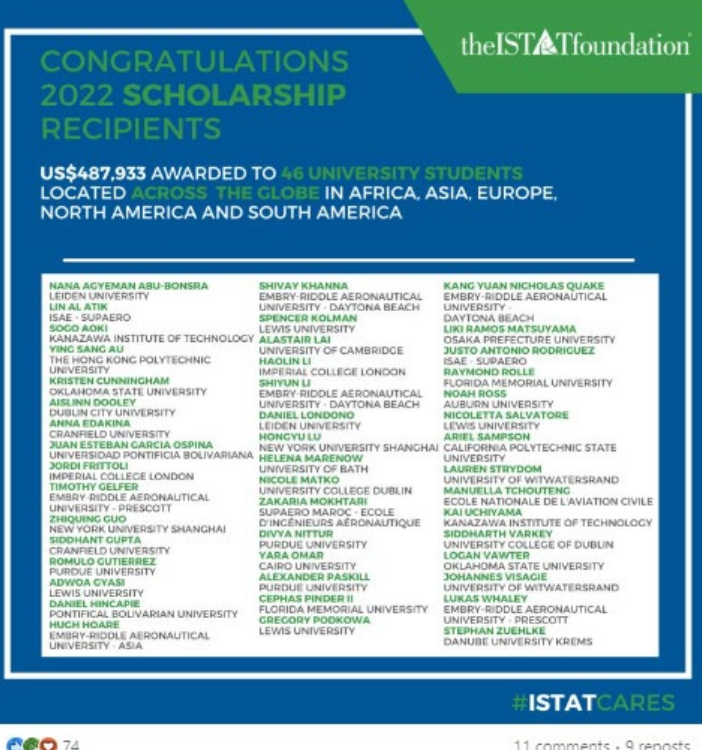

The articles presented within this booklet by the ISTAT Foundation Committee Chairs have each depicted the achievements and goals of our specific committees, together with the personal connections that we all have toward these endeavors. **But the far-reaching impact of the ISTAT Foundation**

wouldn't be possible without its donors. In 2022, across its five giving programs, the ISTAT Foundation disbursed US \$842,833 in support of 32 institutions and 75 individuals, plus an additional US \$1M in support of the Ukraine Relief Fund.

ISTAT member companies may recall previous fundraising initiatives such as the Roundtable, the Friends of the Foundation, the Gala Dinner and other programs. In the wake of these programs, the new Development Committee has convened and conceptualized a new platform for donations on an individualized basis to best meet the corporate initiatives and ESG goals of the donor company.

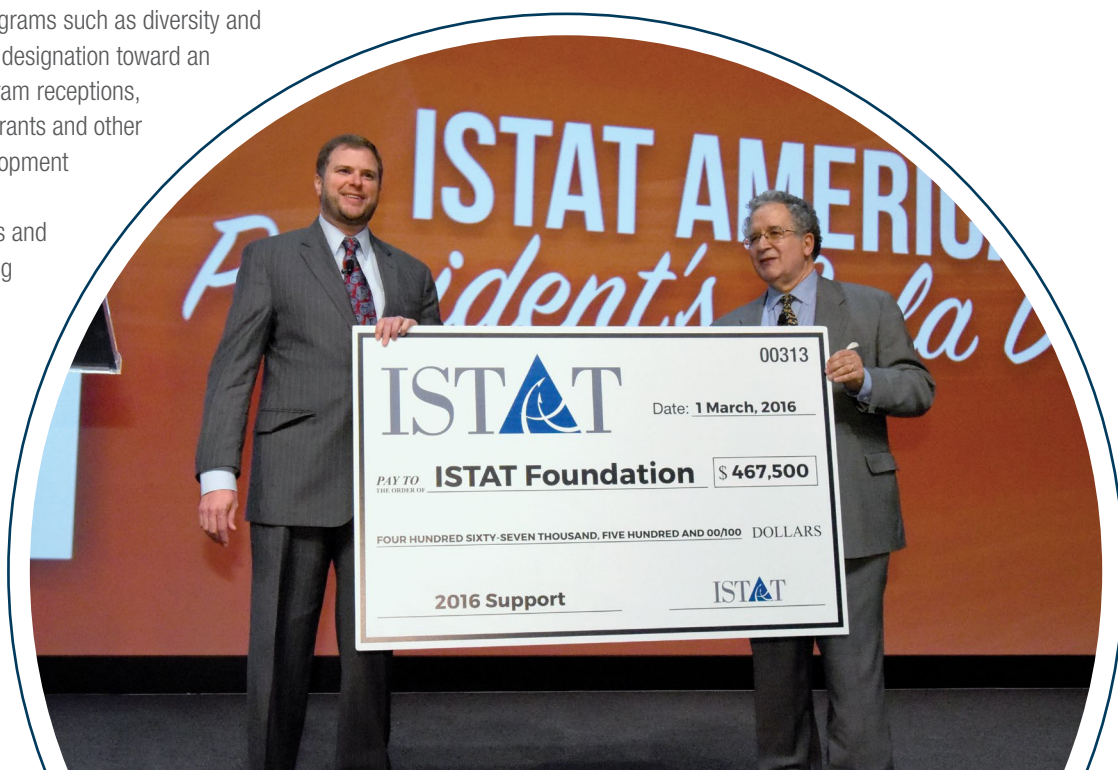
The new Global Sponsorship Program seeks donations from ISTAT member companies in levels of US \$10,000 (bronze), US \$25,000 (silver), US \$50,000 (gold) and US \$100,000 (platinum). The Development Committee looks forward to working with donor companies to allocate the funds toward ISTAT Foundation programs such as diversity and inclusion goals, named scholarships, a designation toward an individual committee, mentorship program receptions, educational developments, additional grants and other ESG objectives. In the future, the Development Committee will endeavor to develop relationships with non-aviation charities and philanthropies as a third pillar of funding aside from ISTAT and the golf events.

ISTAT has been an integral part of my life, having been present at conferences since 1985 as a child of an attendee. As the organization grew in numbers and prominence over the years, the progression toward giving back and investing in the future of the aviation

industry became increasingly important, which led to the creation of the ISTAT Foundation in 1994. My involvement with the ISTAT Foundation began in 2015, when I had a chance encounter with Roland Moore during the ISTAT EMEA walking tour in Rome. At that time, like most people, I supported my alma maters (Vanderbilt University and Northwestern University School of Law) through donations and alumni programs.

We spoke about the importance of education and fostering the next generation of professionals, and through his passionate work on the Scholarship Committee, I gained a keen understanding of the mission and impact of the ISTAT Foundation. Since then, I have served on multiple committees, joined the Board of Trustees and currently serve as a chair. While it takes many hours to meticulously pour through the details of a scholarship application or solicit companies to post internships or draft by-laws, the "rewards" of these efforts are unmatched in comparison insofar as I now have the opportunity to work alongside these students and interns, now as young professionals, in our industry. Having been a small part in supporting their educational and professional journey fills me with pride.
